Dear Clerk,

Enclosed please find a case brought by one of the people on the land to be filed in an Article III court only.

The case is for Breach of Fiduciary Duty by public officers who are bound to support the Constitution, and the Laws of the United States which shall be made in Pursuance thereof, pursuant to Article VI sections 2 and 3.
