MANDATORY JUDICIAL NOTICE - FRE 201

1. This Court is requested to take mandatory judicial notice of adjudicative facts pursuant to Federal Rules of Evidence 201(d). These adjudicative facts are set forth in self-authenticating documents pursuant to FRE 902(1) Domestic public documents under seal, FRE 902(4) Certified copies of public records, and FRE 902(6) Official publications. The documents exhibited with Complainant's Complaint are certified exemplified as Complainant holds the original documents certified out of the public record or under seal or an Affidavit of Publication from a public newspaper.

2. Take mandatory judicial notice of:

a) The Definitive Treaty of Peace 1783 between the United States of America and George the Third, king of Great Britain.

b) The ORDINANCE OF 1787: THE NORTHWEST TERRITORIAL GOVERNMENT (THE CONFEDERATE CONGRESS, JULY 13, 1787).

c) Act of Congress, 1 Stat. 50, August 7, 1789 adopting the ORDINANCE OF 1787, commonly known as the "Northwest Ordinance".

d) Act of Congress, 3 Stat. 56, chap. 89, August 6, 1846, An Act to enable the People of Wisconsin Territory to form a Constitution and State Government, and for the Admission of such State into the Union, and in particular Section 7, clause the Fifth, whereat it is stated: "... said State shall never interfere with ... any regulations Congress may find necessary for securing the title in such soil to bona fide purchasers thereof;"

3. Exhibit A, Certified copy of a purchase *contract*, called a "Deed" recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds, county of Ozaukee, Wisconsin, which evidences

Complainant's ownership in the *private land* specifically *not hypothecated* to the public which has been taken for public use without just compensation. (7 pages).

4. Exhibit B, UCC-11, certified documents from the State of Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions evidencing Complainant's *first priority secured interest* in the private land taken for public use without just compensation. (10 pages).

5. Exhibit D, Senate debate on the sale of public land, March 6, 1820.

6. Exhibit E, Act of Congress on the sale of public land, 3 Stat. 566, chap. 51, April 24, 1820.

7. Exhibit F, documents certified out of the public record of the United States District Court of the Eastern District of Wisconsin evidencing *in pais* agreement *nihil dicit* that the 37 Respondents named therein were public officers, were fiduciaries of the public trust, knew that Complainant's private land had been criminally taken in violation of corporation statutes, knew Complainant's private property had been taken for public use without just compensation and either assented or consented to said taking, knew Complainant's private property had been taken in violation of Constitutional prohibitions they had a fiduciary duty to abide by, knew they were acting dishonestly, and knew they were in breach of their fiduciary duties. These documents are certified out of a lawsuit filed against Ozaukee County by the Notary Public who performed the notarial duties evidenced in said Exhibit F and who was subsequently subjected to retaliation, abuse of legal process, and deprivation of rights by public officers of Respondent corporation, Ozaukee County, for performing his legal and lawful duties as a notary. (34 pages out of approximately 64 pages).


8. Exhibit H, Affidavit of Publication by the officially designated newspaper of Ozaukee County, Wisconsin, for publication of public notices. Public officers were noticed of their personal liability as tort-feasors in the amount of \$15,000,000.00 and their public corporation/vessel known as Ozaukee County would be subject to "grounding", i.e., dissolution, with its operations and assets returned to the public trust known as the county of Ozaukee created by and for the benefit of the people.

9. Exhibit I, certified copy from the Supreme Court of Wisconsin State Law Library of the Laws of Wisconsin, 1853, chapter 21, relating to the erection of the county, "*under the name and title of Ozaukee*", a public trust. (5 pages).

10. Exhibits J & K, evidencing certified copies of Land Patents issued *prior* to the admission of Wisconsin into the Union, from BLM (United States Bureau of Land Management) and recorded in office of Register of Deeds, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin.

11. Exhibit N, Certified copy from the office of the Clerk of Court of Ozaukee County, Wisconsin, of the Criminal Report prepared by Complainant, a victim and witness of crime, filed in a case against STEVEN A. MAGRITZ by district attorney Adam Y. Gerol as retaliation against Complainant for exposing the criminal acts of public officers of Ozaukee County. (7 pages). Previous affidavits, as noted therein, had been filed with the sheriff's department, the office of the district attorney, and the circuit court. All had fallen on blind eyes and deaf ears.
